CASE STORY - below



Swaran Das is a child of parents Parimal Das , working in a Finance department of a private bank and Rupali Das .He was born on 22 August 2003

At 16 months Swaran Das had a fall from the bed. Mother Rupali cannot relate to anything else other than this for Swaran's hearing loss which she began suspecting at one and half years of age.

BERA Test confirmed his Hearing loss to be profound. The parents did not avail any special intervention services for him and he began attending the General School.

Community mobiliser Geeta Kundu got to know about Swaran from another parent Anita Das in 2016 and visited the parents, and convinced them to come to the centre.

Swaran Das was around 12 years old when he began attending sessions at the VAANI Sadhan centre in Siliguri . He is a keen Table Tennis player and has won laurels in the Under 18 category

Prior to attending Sessions at the VAANI Sadhan Centre, Swaran had limited receptive Language. After attending regular sessions at the Centre his expressive Language began to improve and he did considerably well using the combined system.

He developed reading skills and his maths skills have been brought upto the ability to do multiplication tables.

All this has added to boosting his confidence in being together with his peers.

His parents have been very regular in attending the Parents Meetings and workshops.

Mother Rupali says," I wish we were able to access such services earlier around the time he was 4/5 years old. We are thankful to VAANI for also working with us - parents and have meetings and workshops for enhancing our knowledge and skills. Our son has become confident with all that he has been learning here at the centre "

Such have been the changes brought about with a lot more deaf children in Siliguri, with the support of RNCT.

We are grateful to RNCT for partnering with us in this journey and hope to strengthen our partnership further in the days to come .
