Report -April 2021 to June 2021



Parents continue to follow up at home and transform into teachers.

During the period, the two Teachers along with the one CM were able to reach out to 53 deaf children and their families.

A 50% Face to face and 50% Virtual Sessions was taken forward since January 2021 till April 2021. But with the surge of the Pandemic in May'21, Individual Sessions were back on the Virtual Mode

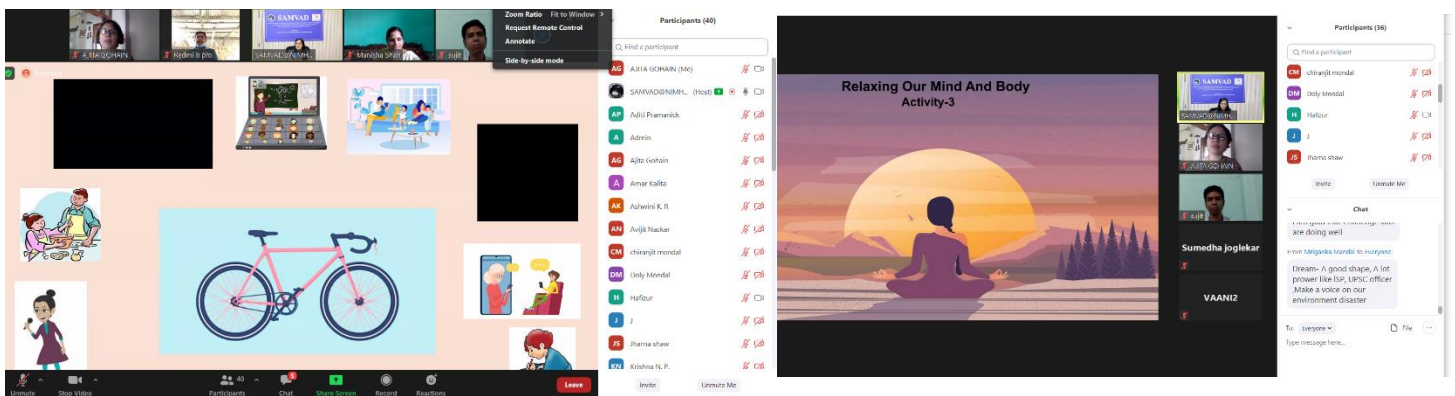




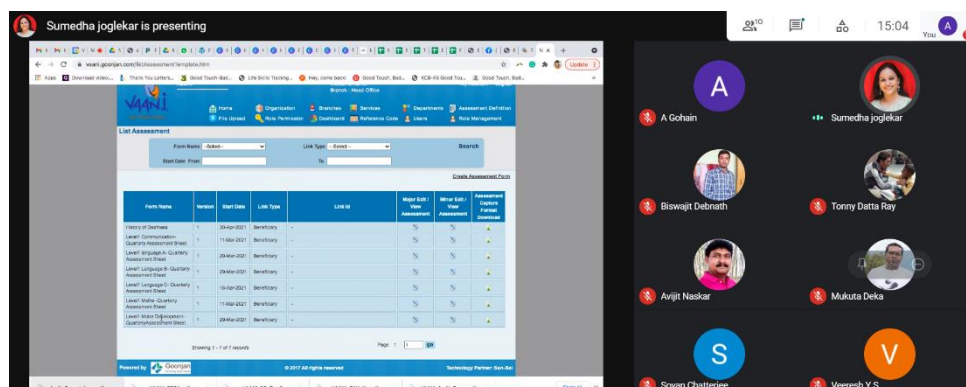
The topics included- Types of Abuse, Signs of Abuse, Tips for Parents to make their children aware and the Child Safety Rule – NO GO TELL

A **Session on Mental Wellness** was conducted for 30 members of the VAANI Team which included the staff of Siliguri Sadhan Centre, to ensure that they all remain motivated to continue with their sessions on a Virtual Mode in spite of challenges .
